SO OTHERS CAN SEE GOD




It's so easy to let a statement such as "Man's chief end is to glorify God" roll off our tongues without really knowing what we are saying. So a couple of years ago I decided to do a Bible study on the subject of glorifying God. I wanted to find out what the Bible says about it. How do we glorify God? I found a number of answers but what caught my attention was how our actions toward other people determine whether we glorify God or shame Him.

In Titus 2:4-5, Paul gives a list of what older women should train the younger women to do: "to love their husbands and children, to be self-controlled and pure, to be busy at home, to be kind, and to be subject to their husbands, so that no one will malign the word of God." This last phrase is a remarkable statement. There's nothing extraordinary about any of the items in that list. They're all part of the routine of daily living. Yet Paul implies that failure in any of those areas brings discredit to God and His Word, while a life lived as Paul described will glorify God.

A couple of paragraphs later, Paul says a similar thing about slaves: "Teach slaves to be subject to their masters in everything, to try to please them, not to talk back to them, and not to steal from them, but to show that they can be fully trusted, so that in every way they will make the teaching about God our Savior attractive" (Titus 2:9-10).

Have you ever thought about the fact that the way you fulfill your duties at work or the way you perform your professional services can make the teaching about God attractive? Why isn't the gospel



more attractive to unbelievers today? Isn't one primary reason the fact that in the everyday affairs of life, we Christians are no different from the general mass of unbelievers? Sure, we don't get drunk or commit adultery, but do we buy and sell, work at our jobs, play at our various sports, or drive on the road in such a way as to glorify God and make His gospel attractive to those who see us?

Paul asked the religious Jews of his day, "You who brag about the law, do you dishonor God by breaking the law? As it is written: 'God's name is blasphemed among the Gentiles because of you'" (Romans 2:23-24). Isn't this true to some

degree today? A person with a Christian fish symbol on his car drives in a discourteous or reckless manner and causes God's name to be ridiculed by unbelievers. I read an article in which the son of a prominent minister was quoted as saying, "If God is like my father, I want nothing to do with Him." The father undoubtedly thought he was glorifying God in the pulpit, but he must have been blaspheming Him in the home.

"Nothing in our conduct," wrote New Testament theologian Simon J. Kistemaker, "should obstruct God's glory from being reflected in us. That is, in everything we do and say, no matter how insignificant, the world should be able to see that we are God's people. Exalting God's glory ought to be our chief purpose in this earthly life."
